The 2025 GDVI Spring Coed Retreat: A Newcomer's Experience

The 2025 GDVI S.L.A.A. Co–Ed Spring Retreat at Daylesford Abbey was a transformational weekend. The Abbey, a picturesque and serene setting, offered comfortable shared or private rooms surrounded by nature and quiet spaces for reflection.

It was clear that the retreat leaders had facilitated this event many times before. The weekend was a well-oiled machine-expertly organized down to the minute with thoughtful attention to detail.

Retreat participants were warmly welcomed with a smooth check-in process, organized handout packets, and a thorough orientation. Meals were low-pressure, relaxed (and delicious!) opportunities to connect with fellows.

As a newcomer and first-time retreatant, I felt extremely comfortable in the co-ed environment. I witnessed fellows being treated with deep respect, clear boundaries, and genuine support. I never felt pressured to engage or socialize unless I felt moved to. I was able to be my natural self in the group, whether I was tired, peaceful, anxious, talkative, quiet, or confused. I felt accepted whether I had low energy or high energy, whether I was eager to participate or needed space.

There were multiple opportunities to connect with others after workshops or during structured agenda time, which included optional group walks and yoga sessions. Additionally, the resident Norbertine monks (ordained priests) made us feel especially welcome in the Abbey, inviting us to join them in chanting Evening Prayer, also known as Vespers.

I encourage both newcomers and seasoned S.L.A.A. members to attend this retreat in the future. Come ready to learn and grow—you will feel guided, inspired, supported, and respected.
